ModelMasters West Road Flying Rules

Only Electric powered, Rubber powered, and glider aircraft are allowed to fly.

No fuel or noisy electric are allowed to fly.

- 1. No flying west of the runway, except south of the runway which runs north and south.
- 2. No flying north of West Rd or close to it.
- 3. No flying over the school playground or close to it.
- 4. Each transmitter must display frequency identification if on 72MHZ or 27MHZ.
- 5. It is strongly recommended that members do not fly alone. If they do they should have a first aid kit.
- 6. Children should not be permitted beyond the spectator area unless under the direct supervision of an adult or under flight instruction.
- 7. Sailplane "high start" lines are to run parallel to the active runway.
- 8. Direction of flight is determined by the wind direction, and should be flown in a race track pattern.
- 9. Flight operations will stop during electrical storms.
- 10. Models will fly only in the pre-designated areas, and will yield right-of-way to full-size aircraft.
- 11. In an emergency and 911 is called, indicate that you are located down a driveway on the east side of Van Wagner Rd, approximately 100 yards from the intersection of Salt Point Turnpike.
- 12. For non-AMA members wishing to experience a "hands-on" model flight, the Academy does allow this, on a one-time basis, per person ONLY, (with the use of a Buddy Box system for RC).

FLYING SITE OPERATIONAL RULES

- 1. Only pilots and assistants are allowed on or below the steps.
- 2. Pilots shall make appropriate announcement when taking off, landing, or emergency situations and wait for acknowledgement before proceeding.
- 3. The AMA Safety Code will be displayed when the field is open for flying.
- 4. Compliance to these safety rules is the responsibility of each participant.
- 5. Ensure the aircraft is identified with the name and address or AMA number of the owner on the inside or affixed to the outside of the model aircraft.
